

Data Availability

- Census Bureau Data
 - Economic Data
 - establishment or firm level
 - Demographic Data
 - household or individual level
 - Combined Employer/Employee Data
 - Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD)
- Health Data
 - Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ)
 - National Center for Health Statistics (NCHS)
- Bureau of Labor Statistics

Internal Microdata Advantages

- No public versions for some datasets
- Greater detail and finer geography
- Larger sample sizes
- Linking Data (economic)
 - Consistent identifiers
 - Business Register
 - External data

Data from Partnering Agencies Accessible in the RDC

- Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality
- National Center for Health Statistics
- Bureau of Labor Statistics
- Bureau of Economic Analysis (in the works)
- Proposal process is with individual agencies and not Census
 - Security background check still with Census

Why do you need a proposal?

- Internal data is confidential
 - Titles 13 & 26 U.S.C. and CIPSEA
- Use is limited to statistical purposes only
- Only Census employees and temporary staff can access microdata
- Requirement of benefits to Census Bureau

Proposal Process

- 1. Identify research idea & datasets
- 2. Email me and Wenhua
 - Include a couple paragraphs of your research idea
- 3. Preliminary proposal
- 4. Proposal development
- 5. Census Review
 - Other Agency Review
- 6. Special Sworn Status application

Proposal Components

- 1. Abstract
- 2. Description of the project
- 3. Predominant Purpose State (PPS)

Abstract

- One page description of the project
 - Research Idea
 - Benefits to Census
 - Benefits to other agencies, if required

Project Description

- 1. Introduction
 - Background and Literature
- 2. Methodology
- 3. Requested Data
- 4. Expected Output
 - Plans for disclosure avoidance
- 5. Duration and Funding

Project Description, Methodology/Data Sections

- Empirical specification & statistical equations
 - Need a clear connection to data
- Requested restricted data and external data
 - Why the need for restricted data?
 - What are the key variables?
 - How will the data be linked?
 - What is the unit of observation?
 - How the process will benefit the Census Bureau?

Predominant Purpose Statement

- 1. Evaluating concepts and practices, continued relevance
- 2. Analyzing demographic and social or economic processes that affect Census programs
- 3. Increasing the utility of Census Bureau data for analyzing public programs, public policy, and/or demographic, economic, or social conditions
- 4. Conducting data collection, processing or dissemination

*Demographic data only (no Federal Tax Information)

Predominant Purpose Statement

- 5. Understanding/improving the quality of data
- 6. Improved methodology to collect, measure, or tabulate
- 7. Enhancing the data collected (e.g. imputation, links)
- 8. Limitations/improving the Business Register
- New data collection needs
- 10. Constructing, verifying, improving sampling frames
- 11. Estimates/characteristics of population
- 12. Methodology for estimating non-response
- 13. Developing statistical weights for a survey

Proposal Review

- Census Review
 - Benefit to Census
 - Scientific merit
 - Need for non-public data
 - Feasibility
 - Risk of disclosure
- Other Agency Review
- Special Sworn Status application

Timeline

- Census review, (1-3 months)
 - (if needed) IRS review (3-7 additional months)
- After approval, SSS Packet
- Background check (2-3 months)
 - Additional security process for non-citizens

Timeline

- Initial email to me and Wenhua
- Preliminary proposal
- Proposal development
 - Involving RDC administrator
- Census Review (1-3 months)
 - Other Agency Review (additional 3-7 months, if needed)
- Special Sworn Status application (2-3 months)
 - Additional security process for non-citizens
- Project work (3-5 years)
